Work during school closure: update

From the w/c 20th April we are moving to a different model of work for some year groups.

Please see below for details. Home learning will continue to be set and submitted (where required) via Show My Homework. The aim of these changes is to help all students with managing the timings of their work.

Year 7-9: **Maths, English, Science** and **MFL** will continue to set work for each lesson they would have had according to the students' timetables. This work will be available to view by 9am on the day of the lesson. As with previous weeks students should not spend more than an hour on each of these lessons.

PE will set physical fitness activities to help student stay fit and healthy.

All other subjects will be moving to mini project based work. These will be set over a 2 week cycle (see table below). These projects will last for 3 weeks and students can then dip in and out when they have the time. The projects will be available to view by 9am on Monday of the week they are set. Students should not be working on these beyond normal school hours and if so may need to limit the amount they are putting into the work.

Years 10 & 12: All subjects will continue to set work for each lesson they would have had according to the students' timetables. This work will be available to view by 9am on the day of the lesson. As with previous weeks students should not spend more than an hour on each of these lessons.

Every 2-3 weeks a 'check point' piece of work will be set that needs submitting. Feedback will be given on this work either via electronic marking, Show My Homework comments, email or an equivalent process.
