

After an enforced break due to Covid-19, we are delighted to report that Junior, Intermediate and Senior Mathematical Challenges have been undertaken by many of our students again during this academic year.


The UKMT Mathematical Challenges are developed by the United Kingdom Mathematics Trust (founded in 1996) with the aim of opening young people's minds to the breadth and depth of mathematics. The challenges are designed to encourage Mathematical reasoning, precision of thought and fluency in using mathematical techniques to solve interesting and demanding problems.

Our students really enjoy tackling the papers and all of the problems within the Mathematical Challenges are designed to make individuals think – you might wish to have a go at the question below: All students who opt to tackle the Junior Mathematical Challenge receive a certificate for their participation. We are especially pleased to report that 41 of our Year 7 students secured an award for their participation in their Mathematical Challenge (4 Gold, 11 Silver and 26 Bronze). Likewise, 30 of our Year 8 students secured an award for their participation in their Mathematical Challenge (2 Gold, 9 Silver and 19 Bronze).

We would like to congratulate everyone who took part and give a special mention to four of our students - Scarlett A, Holly W, Monty C and Thom P for their achievements and being selected to take part in the Junior Kangaroo which is the follow-on round to the Junior Mathematical Challenge.

### Year 7 Dovedale Trip

Recently, Year 7 have been on a trip to Dovedale. Dovedale is an area around the River Dove which is a tributary of the River Trent. Dovedale has stunning views due to the V shaped valley which the River Dove flows at the bottom. The V shaped valley has made that shape by the river eroding the limestone. The first thing we saw was a water trough made of concrete because limestone lets the water in which forms caves that we see later and it can also form underground lakes this could make the ground unstable.

As we were walking we found out that the hills were dangerous because of how steep they were. We saw slopes with rocks sticking out, these are hard rocks left after the limestone eroded away. Also as we examined the caves we found that the limestone was quite slippery due to weathering.

We walked along the river and we could see where the river had eroded the rocks on the side.

After walking 8km and seeing the river grow we ended the trip with ice creams. We had a great trip!

### GCSE Year 10 Burbage Brook Fieldwork

During July, the GCSE Geography Year 10 students embarked on fieldwork at Burbage Brook, Longshaw Estate. Equipped with callipers, metre sticks, and measuring tapes, they set out to investigate the changes in downstream characteristics, guided by the Bradshaw Model theory.

With 120 participants eagerly immersing themselves in the fieldwork, they meticulously measured the width, depth, and sediment size at two designated sites, in order to meet their aim. Upon returning to school, the students meticulously presented their findings, employing geo-located pie charts and line graphs to illustrate their data. The remarkable alignment between their observations and the Bradshaw model provided a sense of accomplishment, solidifying the significance of practical application alongside theoretical understanding of river characteristics.

This enthralling fieldwork not only deepened their comprehension of geographical processes but also fostered the development of critical data analysis and effective communication skills.

The fieldwork exploration at Burbage Brook, left an indelible mark on the students' geographical journey, fueling a passion for geographical enquiry and enriching their understanding of the Bradshaw Model.


### German School Visit


