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Year 8 Languages Day



On 12th January Year 8 participated in the Y8 Languages Day, an exciting event where they could learn more about languages. Students were working in small groups and at first they had to choose a multilingual team name. Students impressed us with their creativity and among our favourite team names were Neohongo (how you say Japanese in Japanese), Moi moi (hello in Finnish) and Greek Gods. Next on the agenda was the big Minster languages quiz as a warm up. Round 1 was on general facts about languages and in round 2 they had to match greetings in foreign languages with the correct language. Next up was the language detectives activity where students were given the same sentence in 8 different languages and had to work out what the different components meant.

The main part of the day was to learn a new language by themselves. Students had picked their language before the day. Languages to choose from were Japanese, Chinese, Ukrainian, Arabic, Korean, Turkish, Panjabi and Greek. They then had to research how to say a list of basic phrases in that language and teach those phrases to each other. After learning the phrases, they were paired up with another table and taught them their newly learnt language.

GCSE Geography Students Conduct Urban Regeneration Study in Birmingham

On January 9th and 10th, 120 GCSE geography students visited Birmingham to analyse the effects of urban regeneration on the city. The students participated in a series of fieldwork activities with an interest in exploring the sustainable benefits of regeneration in preparation for their Paper 2 examination.

The main focus of the trip was a comprehensive environmental quality survey, providing data on the positive impacts of urban regeneration initiatives on the city's environment and society. Additionally, a series of perception surveys were conducted to gauge the students' sentiments towards the changes, offering valuable

insights into personalised perspectives at the fieldwork sites.

The students actively engaged in land use mapping and train frequency data, around the impressive Bull Ring, Grand Central and New Street area. This exercise aimed to deepen their understanding of the practical implications of urban planning and development in the 21st century.

While the trip was academically oriented, the students also took the opportunity to explore the Bull Ring shops and restaurants. This added an element of leisure and peer work, to their educational experience, allowing for a more holistic understanding of the city's regeneration efforts.

Teachers and accompanying staff acknowledged the students' exemplary behavior and enthusiasm during the trip, commending their commitment to the fieldwork and geographical components. The success of the fieldtrip highlights the effectiveness of integrating real-world experiences into the educational curriculum.






Year 9 Geography visits to Brackenhurst Nottingham Trent University

The Minster Minis handbells team was formed in June 2021 and use a three octave set of Malmark Handbells leased from the William Hartley Memorial Fund.

There are two teams that rehearse after school on Mondays and Tuesdays, and are taught by me. It has been fun watching the children learn new techniques like martellato and thumb damping. At a recent concert to the Junior School parents, the teams played Away in a Manger normally then demonstrated how the carol sounded when played using martellato and then thumb damping. We demonstrated circular ringing and damping to the parents, who were fascinated and have asked for us to do another concert later in the year. The children are in years 3 to year 6 inclusive.

I asked two of the older children to write a report of the concert.

John has written:

"When we stood on the stage in front of all our parents, I was very concerned about the performance. Although rehearsals sometimes went wrong, the determination of the team got us through the concert and I remember it as a great one. I have been in the handbells team for almost three years now and everyone who joins brings something new to the team. I love to play handbells with my friends and our wonderful teacher, Mrs Gees. All of the pieces in the concert were good, but we can always improve. I hope to continue ringing handbells for as long as possible. I have noticed the importance of listening to each other in order to ring together successfully."

The Monday team played Silent Night, We wish you a Merry Christmas and Jingle Bells.

Imogen, wrote:

"I am part of the Tuesday handbells team at the Minster Junior School in Southwell. Before the Christmas holidays, we did a concert of Christmas carols and played Good King Wenceslas, Canon by Tallis and Away in a Manger. Mrs Gees teaches us every Tuesday afternoon. I think the concert went really well and I like playing handbells because it is fun and we make an amazing sound!"

I have had to split the original team into two teams because of commitments to attend chorister rehearsals in Southwell Minster on various days, after school. This has meant that we are concentrating on twelve bell music for the moment rather than two or three octave music.

This may change in the future if the two teams amalgamate again, once I retire, and leave the school in April 2024. The handbells team will be taught by the year 3/4 teacher, Mrs Mason, who has been sitting in on rehearsals since September 2023 learning the various techniques for successful ringing. Mrs Mason's daughter, Nellie, plays handbells and can teach her mum all about circular ringing and other techniques!
